FINAL ORDER

This matter appeared before the Florida Gaming Control Commission at a duly-noticed public meeting on October 16, 2025, for final agency action pursuant to sections 120.569 and 120.57(2), Florida Statutes. After a complete review of the records in this matter, the Commission makes the following findings of fact and conclusions of law:

1. An Administrative Complaint was filed in this case on August 28, 2025, alleging Respondent is subject to revocation of his slot machine/cardroom/pari-mutuel individual combination occupational license under rules 75-11.005(4) and 75-11.011, Florida Administrative Code, as well as permanent exclusion from all pari-mutuel facilities and all facilities of a slot machine licensee within the state of Florida. A copy of the Administrative Complaint is attached hereto as Exhibit "A" and incorporated by reference.

2. The Administrative Complaint, Election of Rights form, an Explanation of Rights, and a cover letter were served on Respondent via certified mail.

3. The Election of Rights form, Explanation of Rights, and cover letter informed Respondent that a written response to the Complaint, including the right to request a hearing, was

due within 21 days of actual service of the Complaints. *See* § 120.569(1), Fla. Stat., and Fla. Admin. Code R. 28-106.111.

4. On or about September 12, 2025, Respondent returned a signed Election of Rights form and selected "Option 3" which states that Respondent does not dispute the allegations of material fact in the Administrative Complaint and waives his right to any form of hearing. Respondent, by selecting this option, requests that a Final Order imposing a penalty and/or fine be entered in this case. A copy of the Election of Rights is attached hereto as Exhibit "B" and incorporated by reference.

5. Respondent has waived his right to request a hearing in which there is a disputed issue of material fact.

Having considered the Administrative Complaint and Respondent's waiver of his right to request a hearing, and being otherwise fully advised in the premises, it is hereby

ORDERED and ADJUDGED:

6. The allegations of fact and the conclusions of law in the Administrative Complaint are adopted in their entirety herein.

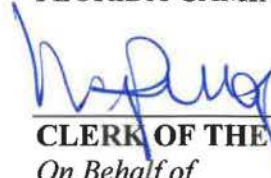
7. Respondent's slot machine/cardroom/pari-mutuel individual combination occupational license, number 10068705, is hereby **REVOKED**.

8. Respondent is hereby **PERMANENTLY EXCLUDED** from all pari-mutuel facilities and all facilities of a slot machine licensee within the state of Florida.

This Final Order shall take effect upon being filed with the Clerk of the Commission.

ADMINISTRATIVE COMPLAINT

The Florida Gaming Control Commission, Division of Pari-Mutuel Wagering (“Petitioner”), files this Administrative Complaint against Krishna Roopchand (“Respondent”), and alleges:

1. Petitioner is the state agency charged with regulating pari-mutuel wagering, slot machines, and cardroom operations pursuant to chapters 550, 551, and 849, Florida Statutes.
2. At all times material hereto, Respondent held a slot machine/cardroom/pari-mutuel wagering individual combination license, number 10068705, issued pursuant to section 551.107(2)(b), Florida Statutes.
3. At all times material hereto, PPI, Inc. d/b/a Harrah’s Pompano Beach (“Harrah’s”) was a facility operated by a permitholder authorized to conduct pari-mutuel wagering, cardroom operations, and slot machine operations in the state of Florida.
4. At all times material hereto, Respondent worked as Cage Cashier at Harrah’s.
5. On or about January 3, 2025, Respondent’s employment with Harrah’s was terminated.

6. On or about January 3, 2025, Respondent was ejected and permanently excluded from Harrah's.

COUNT I

7. Petitioner realleges and incorporates the allegations contained within paragraphs one through six as though fully set forth herein.

8. Upon review of Harrah's surveillance footage, Harrah's staff observed Respondent remove \$500 in currency from the vault during his shift on December 30, 2024, and \$400 in currency from the vault on January 1, 2025.

9. Rule 75-11.005(4), Florida Administrative Code, provides, in relevant part, that "[n]o person shall, either directly or indirectly: (a) [e]mploy or attempt to employ any device, scheme, or artifice to defraud any participant in a game or the cardroom operator."

10. Section 849.086(14)(a), Florida Statutes, provides that:

The commission may deny a license or the renewal thereof, or may suspend or revoke any license, when the applicant has: violated or failed to comply with the provisions of this section or any rules adopted pursuant thereto; knowingly caused, aided, abetted, or conspired with another to cause any person to violate this section or any rules adopted pursuant thereto; or obtained a license or permit by fraud, misrepresentation, or concealment; or if the holder of such license or permit is no longer eligible under this section.

11. Based on the foregoing, Respondent violated rule 75-11.005(4), Florida Administrative Code, by employing a device, scheme, or artifice to defraud the cardroom operator, and is therefore subject to suspension or revocation of his occupational license under section 849.086(14)(a), Florida Statutes.

COUNT II

12. Petitioner realleges and incorporates the allegations contained within paragraphs one through six as though fully set forth herein.

13. Section 550.0251(6), Florida Statutes, provides in relevant part:

In addition to the power to exclude certain persons from any pari-mutuel facility in this state, the commission may exclude any person from any and all pari-mutuel facilities in this state for conduct that would constitute, if the person were a licensee, a violation of this chapter or the rules of the commission. The commission may exclude from any pari-mutuel facility within this state any person who has been ejected from a pari-mutuel facility in this state or who has been excluded from any pari-mutuel facility in another state by the governmental department, agency, commission, or authority exercising regulatory jurisdiction over pari-mutuel facilities in such other state.

(Emphasis added).

14. Section 551.112, Florida Statutes, provides:

In addition to the power to exclude certain persons from any facility of a slot machine licensee in this state, the commission may exclude any person from any facility of a slot machine licensee in this state for conduct that would constitute, if the person were a licensee, a violation of this chapter or the rules of the commission. The commission may exclude from any facility of a slot machine licensee any person who has been ejected from a facility of a slot machine licensee in this state or who has been excluded from any facility of a slot machine licensee or gaming facility in another state by the governmental department, agency, commission, or authority exercising regulatory jurisdiction over the gaming in such other state. This section does not abrogate the common law right of a slot machine licensee to exclude a patron absolutely in this state.

(Emphasis added).

15. Based on the foregoing, Respondent is subject to exclusion from all licensed pari-mutuel wagering facilities and any facility of a slot machine licensee in the state of Florida based on his ejection and permanent exclusion from Harrah's on January 3, 2025.

COUNT III

16. Petitioner realleges and incorporates paragraphs numbered one through two as if set forth fully herein.

17. On or about January 3, 2025, Respondent was arrested in Broward County, Florida, and was charged with Grand Theft – Greater than \$750, Less than \$5,000.

18. Respondent failed to provide written notification to Petitioner within five days of his arrest on January 3, 2025.

19. Rule 75-11.011, Florida Administrative Code, states:

Any cardroom occupational licensee shall provide written notification to the division when the licensee has been arrested, indicted, or charged in any other way with a criminal offense within five days of the arrest, or if not arrested, within five days of the receipt of a charging document. Licensees are not required to report non-criminal traffic offenses.

20. Based on the foregoing, Respondent violated rule 75-11.011, Florida Administrative Code, by failing to provide written notification to the Commission within five days of his arrest on January 3, 2025.

WHEREFORE, Petitioner respectfully requests the Florida Gaming Control Commission enter an Order revoking Respondent's slot machine/cardroom/pari-mutuel individual combination occupational license, number 10068705, and excluding Respondent from all licensed pari-mutuel wagering facilities and any facility of a slot machine licensee in the state of Florida, in accordance with sections 550.0251(6) and 551.112, along with any other remedy provided by chapters 550 and 551, and section 849.086, Florida Statutes, and/or the rules promulgated thereunder.

Any request for an administrative proceeding to challenge or contest the charges contained in this Administrative Complaint must conform to rule 28-106.2015, Florida Administrative Code. Pursuant to rule 28-106.111, Florida Administrative Code, you must request a hearing within 21 days from receipt of this Notice, or you will waive your right to request a hearing.

Mediation under section 120.573, Florida Statutes, is not available to resolve this Administrative Complaint.
